Covid 19 cases

It is inevitable that with the return to school, we are likely to see an increase in positive cases within our community. Schools have received further clarification on the management of positive cases in schools on Friday evening. The Parent Flowchart has been shared on the school website and has also been inserted on this newsletter. This gives advice if your child is identified as a close contact.

Like many of my principal colleagues, I have spent significant time this first weekend back working through close contacts with PHA and contacting parents. I have had confirmation, following conflicting information during the week, that a close contact pupil should be taking the Day 2 test and only return to school if NEGATIVE. However, the pupil can RETURN TO SCHOOL following the Day 8 test, prior to receiving the result. Also, if a pupil has had a positive result within the last 90 days, they are free to return to school without a PCR test, unless they display new symptoms.

I feel this is going to be a very challenging term in managing this, on top of trying to maintain everything else in school as normally as possible. On that note, I would like to make sure that we can keep our school/ parent partnership working as effectively as possible and maintain a high level of TRUST operating both ways.

We will continue a policy of parents notifying school of test results, either positive or negative, to bguthrie493@c2ken.net. I TRUST parents will do the right thing and follow PHA guidance. If you are not in a position to have your child take a PCR test, then they should self-isolate for ten days.

I wish to pass on a huge THANK YOU to so many of you who have followed our updated guidance with regards parking off site. I know it places additional pressures of time in the morning for many families, but it has been fantastic to see the vast majority of parents keeping the lower area free for drop offs, pedestrians, staff cars, taxis and those with mobility issues who have previously contacted school-both in the morning and afternoon.
