## Literacy

We start Year 6 Literacy, focussing on recounts and using questioning techniques to develop our writing. Please encourage your child to use a dictionary and thesaurus, as we will be using these in class throughout the year.

We will look at idioms and the ability to identify idioms which we use in everyday life. We will have a weekly focus on building your child's comprehension skills. Please support your child as much as possible when completing their reading homework and encourage them to discuss the plot, characters and to form opinions on what they have read. These are important elements which we are aiming to develop through guided reading. Please ensure you child comes to school having fully prepared their reading ahead of their 'reading day.'

We are pleased to introduce ACCELERATED READING to Primary 6 this year. Your children will complete a simple test online within school to establish their reading level and choose their individual reading book accordingly.




Our topic this term is 'Full of life'. We will be looking at all aspects of

Homework

Homework is set daily. This could be Phonics, Literacy, Numeracy or topic based. Homework will always reinforce what has been taught in class and will be explained to the pupils before it is sent home.

Please sign the bottom of your child's homework and ensure homework is handed in on time.

The spellings and tables jotter (purple book) must be brought in to school each day to be marked in preparation for Friday test. On a Monday there will be a hw page linked to their number focus which can be put into their purple book.
