# A NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION-Punctuality/Attendance.

In most cases, our pupils come to school on time every day. In making sure they do, you are helping to establish good practice for the future. Patterns of lateness and absence that start in primary school can end up in truancy in post-primary school and "hard to break habits" for the work place. So please make sure you HELP your child by:

- Being firm about bedtimes.
- Encouraging them to prepare the night before, those items they will need for school the next day.
- Making sure they are in time to have breakfast and to leave the house promptly.

REMEMBER: SCHOOL COMMENCES AT 8.50 am. Pod doors are open from 8:40pm. If a parent needs to speak to a teacher, in the morning time as school is starting is <u>not the appropriate time to do it</u>. Please ensure you come earlier to school with your child if a message needs passed forward.



### Application Portals-Nursery, Primary 1 and Year 8

Application portals are now open for all pupils to apply for a place in Nursery, Primary 1 (current Nursery) and Year 8 (current P7)

The EA Admissions 'portal' can be found at www.eani.org.uk/parents/admissions, and will open for applications for both Ebrington PS and Ebrington NU from 9th-26th January 2024.

For parents new to this process, this means parents making the application directly to EA, without involvement of school. An account



needs to be set up with the portal and can be done prior to 9th January.

Could I also make clear that, even if your child has attended our Nursery Unit, you MUST make an application for the primary school. Please do not be confused by wording on the online portal about 'reception class'.

Post Primary Applications (our current Primary 7 pupils) for school year beginning September 2024 will open on Tuesday 30 January 2024 at 12 noon.

For our current Primary 6 pupils, we will be holding a post primary transfer meeting in school before the end of February. I know some parents are keen to understand the process, particularly those who haven't been through it before. It is most beneficial to have our current P7 pupils through the application process, as more accurate information should be available at the later stage.

### Primary 2 'Extended Hours'

**REMINDER**: P2 pupils now stay in school on a Monday-Thursday until 3:00pm, but continue to finish on a Friday at 2:00pm, as is the case for the rest of the school.

## **Parent-Teacher interviews**

A letter with more detailed information will be issued home this week regarding parent interviews for our pupils, coming up in the next few weeks. Please complete the appropriate time slots that would suit you and return to the teacher, once received.



# Regular hair checks

I would encourage parents to carry out regular hair checks for 'visitors'. Often, on return to school after a break, there may be a good chance of these visitors appearing. They can be removed by wet combing with a special fine-toothed comb. You should try this method first:

- •wash hair with ordinary shampoo
- •apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)
- •comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends

#### **After Schools Clubs**

Under no circumstances can pupils any longer be added on to the afterschool lists during the week, due to appropriate adult: pupil ratios, because of a late/ forgotten booking.

Please ensure that you book at the correct time, by 11:59pm on the Sunday night for the following week.

This will save any embarrassment of a refusal when phoning in to the school office staff. During the autumn term, we had far too many parents phoning on a daily 'ad hoc' basis, looking to book for that day. This simply will no longer be accommodated.

#### **School Christmas Raffle**

Our school Christmas raffle this year brought in a profit of £1036. Thank you to everyone who supported the raffle by either donating items for prizes or by buying tickets. This money will be used to purchase some essential items for throughout school.



#### **Car Park**

I wish to pass on a huge THANK YOU to so many of you who have followed our guidance with regards to parking and drop off. I know it places a small additional pressure of time in the morning for some families, but it has been fantastic to see the vast majority of parents keeping the lower area free for drop offs, pedestrians, staff cars, taxis and those with mobility issues who have previously contacted school-both in the morning and afternoon. Please continue to follow this.

## \*\*REMINDER\*\*

NO parent cars should be driving down the side of school towards the Nursery, as this is an exit for pupils at various points of the school day.

NO cars should be parked on the double yellow lines within the school site.
