Christmas Week in school

From Monday 7 December-Friday 11 December 2020, we are planning to have a Christmas Week in school. During the week, we are planning a number of Christmas events/ activities that we can safely manage in school. A menu for dinner and a booking slip (Online via FORMS) will be sent out shortly to confirm numbers. Monies still need to be paid and dinner booked through the SchoolMoney app closer to the time.

We will be learning some **Christmas songs** within our 'bubbles' and will be recording these to be uploaded to the online classrooms for parents to see. **This recording is planned to be done on Wednesday 9 December,** so we want to make sure everyone in school are wearing Christmas jumpers on that day.

On Friday 11 December, school will close a little earlier than usual, at 1:15pm. This is to allow staff to come together, in some form, and enjoy a very well-deserved 'socially-distanced' Christmas lunch together.

School Enrolment: REMINDER

Information on the procedures for school admissions in September 2021 should be available on the EA website earnighte-number-2020 for Pre-school/Primary 1 places and for post-primary places (Year 8 entry). This means parents making the application directly to EA, without involvement of school, for Nursery and Year 1. School are currently updating criteria to send back to EA for Nursery and Year 1 admissions. The dates given for the application process for primary and nursery schools currently is that it will go live on the EA website on the 7 January 2021, with a closing date for applications on 29 January 2021. Post-primary applications are also going online this year, rather than the traditional forms that were completed. Exact dates have yet to be given for this, but it should be during January/ February 2021

School Flu Vaccine: REMINDER

REMINDER: The school health team will be visiting school on **Thursday 26**th **November** to give the nasal flu vaccine to all pupils who have returned the brown envelope to school with the required information.

School Cashless System

We still have a number of parents not booking dinners for their child in school. We continue to manage, as effectively as possible, the spread of Covid-19 within our school community. We need your continued support to allow us to do this.



Please remember, if your child has been in contact with someone who has tested positive, you SHOULD NOT send them to school. If a child is waiting on a test result, they must NOT ATTEND SCHOOL until confirmed negative and no further symptoms are evident after 48 hours. If you have any doubt, please contact school.

If required to self-isolate, please ensure to do this for the required 14-day period. **Even if you are tested** during this time, and present with a negative result, you are still required to self-isolate for the period of time identified at the start.
