# Parent Interviews

It <u>was</u> our intention to manage parent interviews this week for all pupils P1-P7, based on every pupil being back to remote learning, as previously stated by Education Minister.

The announcement for all pupils returning this week, which we are so grateful for, obviously had a major impact on these plans.

While we are still not able to hold face to face interviews in the large numbers as previously, we need to manage these either via telephone call or Zoom. This then creates further issues in school, as we have only three external lines that can be used at one time and have limited wireless connectivity/ broadband width for running Zoom for all class teachers at the same time.

Our only way forward for this will be to manage parent interviews by telephone after the Easter break. As many of the staff live a considerable distance from home, it will therefore mean closing school early 2-3 afternoons to allow staff to travel home and make necessary calls.

I am aware that some parents have been emailing teachers directly, requesting updates on their child's progress in certain rooms since the return to school. Please remember, you have been involved as one of the 'primary educators' during lockdown and home schooling. Teachers had been in regular contact through SeeSaw and Google Classroom, giving lots of feedback during lockdown. With the demands of face to face teaching, it is neither viable or feasible for staff to be engaging in the same way remotely, as they now have all the daily planning, preparation and feedback to engage with.

We will be in touch on our return, week beginning 12 April, with further details of how these interviews will be organised and managed.
