Parent Interviews

As previously stated, it <u>was</u> our intention to manage parent interviews this week for all pupils P1-P7, based on every pupil being back to remote learning, as previously stated by Education Minister.

Teachers had been in regular contact through SeeSaw and Google Classroom, giving lots of feedback during school closures. Reports will be going out mid-June and there will be an opportunity for parents to make contact with their child's class teacher to discuss any matters, if they wish.
