Ref: Supporting Children of Key Workers/SEN/ Vulnerable in Primary School

Education Minister Peter Weir MLA has announced that in light of the current crisis in public health, the Northern Ireland Executive has agreed that the following necessary actions are proposed. These replace the actions set out in the letter to schools of 31 December 2020.

Effective from: Thursday 7th January

- All mainstream education providers, including pre-school education settings, primary and post
 primary schools are required to provide remote learning at home to their pupils rather than face
 to face teaching in school, until the half term break in the middle of February.
- Remote learning and the removal of face to face teaching should be temporary and last no longer than necessary, and therefore will remain under review by the Executive.
- Vulnerable children and children of key workers (one parent) to have access to schools for supervised learning. Vulnerable children include amongst others all statemented children

We have been open since Tuesday 5th January to support identified Key Workers/ SEN/ Vulnerable pupils who have previously made contact with/ been contacted by school to request/ provide a place for their child/ ren. This guidance now states that our pre-school Nursery is closed also, so we need to consider provision for these families.

Before clicking on the link and completing the form, I would ask you to look at the key worker situation as 'Need versus Entitlement'. Hopefully you all know well that Ebrington PS & NU will always do their best to support the needs of its school community.

This form must be completed by Thursday 7 January, 12 midday to allow sufficient planning time on Friday 8 January

What I mean by this above statement is please only request this provision for your child/ family when there is no other alternative. We are in a much worse position with regards positive cases of Covid than we were with our last school closure in March 2020 and also have a new variant within Northern Ireland. As principal, I want to ensure that we are doing everything to support our school community-pupils, parents, staff and all families, in not just their learning, but also in their health and well-being.

The lockdown and school closures coming in to force on Thursday are there for a reason. It is about limiting travel, limiting interaction and reducing contact. The best way this can be done is reducing footfall within the school building, leading to less mixing, less close contact and ultimately less positive cases and illness. If a child can remain at home, for their and the family's safety, they should remain at home.

Please be advised that schools will be performing 'supervised learning' for those children coming in, rather than direct teaching. Teachers are managing remote learning with all the pupils not in school and pupils will be supervised in the classroom/ hall by at least two of our school classroom assistants.

Any pupil who presents a risk of flight from the building or who may require safe handling cannot be considered for school placement.

The operating hours are 8:45am-3:00pm from Monday 11th January 2021 through to Friday 12th February through to (including P1 pupils), although please note, we will still operate the standard 2:00pm finish for <u>all pupils</u> on a Friday.

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If using the key worker/ vulnerable option, your child should come to school with:
-school uniform and coat;
-their own supply of tissues;
-any work packs previously distributed by teachers, if individually requested to do so this week via SeeSaw or Google Classroom;
- a packed lunch, water and snack for break
-any stationery that would normally have been brought in for their year group.
